


EXTERNAL EVENTS FOR LOWER SCHOOL PUPILS

The **British Academy of Film and Television Arts** (BAFTA) has launched a new campaign to help young people build a creative career. On their **Young BAFTA** website, they are currently advertising a **Young Game Designers competition**, which is open to students aged 10 and above.



WonderWhat is a free web app for students aged 13 and above, which matches them to creative careers and helps them explore the different options. It also contains information from industry partners and from students currently studying creative subjects.

Queen Mary University is holding an **English, Drama and Creative Writing Taster Day** for students in **Years 10-13** on Wednesday 13 December. This focuses on London and considers how the city has been imagined by writers and artists as a meeting place of global histories and cultures. Students will also think about London as a theatrical city, and hear how contemporary creative writers respond to the city.

The two-day course takes place on Saturday 27 January and 3 February and is for students with a good level of English, who want to learn how to teach the language to others. The projects must meet the criteria listed on the **Bulkeley-Evans HMC Scholarship Fund** website, and the application deadline is Friday 31 May.

University Taster Days:

The Faculty of Medicine, Health and Social Care at **Canterbury Christ Church University** is holding a **Health Professions Information Evening** on Wednesday 29 November at their Medway campus. Students can meet health academics, talk to student ambassadors, experience the clinical facilities and gain some hands-on experience of the different professions.

Work Experience:

Premed Projects is running two courses in December. On Saturday 9 December, <u>Surgery Live</u> is a virtual work experience day where students can observe a patient from initial presentation through to diagnosis and treatment. On Saturday 16 December, students aged 14-18 will have the chance to enter the dissection room at a London hospital and learn about <u>Brain anatomy and</u> <u>biology</u> using medically donated cadavers.

Birmingham University Hospitals Trust is running a free **NHS Virtual Work Experience** programme in collaboration with Medic Mentor. This is open to students aged 14 and over, and is a six-month programme offering an insight into medicine and dentistry. The e-learning format allows students to complete the programme in their own time, and they are also able to discuss their learning with a doctor or medical student.



International Universities:



For students who are seriously considering applying to university in the **United States**, attending a college tour can be a good way of exploring a range of universities and gaining information about the application process. There are many companies that offer tours, but one I have tried for myself is **TS College Tours**. Their tours are not cheap, but I was very impressed with the organization and the knowledge of the staff involved and would recommend this to anyone who wants to visit and compare a range of colleges.
